
Activity - Safety - A Shared Responsibility



You need:

A shape of fabric corresponding to the above

A group card (e.g. BOT/Principal)

A large number of blank slips of paper

Marker pens

Organisation


Divide the group into 8 smaller groups, give each group one of the following written on a card:

- 1. Person in charge flag
- 2. EOTC coordinator
- 3. Activity leaders
- 4. Board of trustees and principal
- 5. Students
- 6. Assistants
- 7. National bodies
- 8. Government

Task

- Each group brainstorm the responsibilities for Safe Outside the classroom
 Learning Experiences for the group they have been given. (if you have only 6 people combine 1&2 and 7&8)
- 2. Write each idea on a **separate** slip of paper. (Choose a specific EOTC activity if you like, eg sailing.)
- 3. Ask each group in turn to lay on the floor their piece of fabric, their card and their slips of paper verbalising the responsibility written on them until a sailboat is formed.
- 4. Discuss the shared relationship analogy. What could the mast represent? Will the boat still sail if the spinnaker is down? Why are students in the mainsail?
- 5. What are the key messages?
- 6. Refer to Chapter 2 pages 16-17 (analogy) and 18-27 (responsibilities)
